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These ventures that feed upon the dock laborers. It should be borne in mind that the dock laborer has employed more for only a part of the year. The winter is to him a period of sudden misery in which he habitually starves and which he may not see in for work. The Tonawanda industry are largely based upon the lumber trade. In order to handle the millions of feet of lumber that come to the Twin Cities in the summer, a large force of men is needed. When fall comes, these men can not be kept in the mill, and are sent back to the laborers in the factories. The result is that wages are steadily low and a "steady job" at almost any wage, is held to be the greatest prize in the workingman's history of life.

On the whole, then, 62 a day for work during six months of the year, cannot be considered a very high wage. The Tonawanda newspapers would try to justify their readers into thinking. In order to alienate the sympathy of their fellow-workers in Buffalo, the newspaper accounts always refer to the Tonawanda dock-laborers as "foreigners." As though that made any difference!

In the Tonawanda, regular and irregular among the workers is accepted as the normal condition. In the winter, conditions are always especially severe. WAGES FOR BETTER CONDITIONS

Members of States' Union No. 16 R. & C. W. L. U. of A. are putting up a grand fight for shorter hours of labor and improved sanitary conditions in the two big trust-lake-shops of the city.
